Pacts on table, PM in Israel to strengthen bilateral ties

AS INDIA AND ISRAEL look to elevate their strategic partnership, Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in Tel Aviv Wednesday on a two-day visit. He is meeting Israeli counterpart Benjamin Netanyahu and the two sides are expected to sign a slew of pacts in the economic, security and diplomatic spheres to deepen bilateral ties.

Modi's visit to Israel is taking place amid turmoil in the region, talk of a potential US strike on Iran should negotiations fail in Geneva and US President Donald Trump's Board of Peace initiative to rebuild Gaza and deploy an international stabilisation force in the ravaged Strip. India has stayed away from the board and attended its first meeting as an observer. Modi was received by Netanyahu and his wife Sara at the Ben Gurion international

Govt plans price support for chana

TO REPLENISH THE buffer and ensure remunerative prices to farmers, the agriculture ministry has approved procurement of 2.3 MT of chana (gram) in Maharashtra, Gujarat, MP and Rajasthan under the price support scheme (PSS) for 2026-27 rabi marketing season. The agriculture ministry has approved procurement of 0.76 MT of chana from Maharashtra, 0.58 MT from Madhya Pradesh, 0.55 MT from Rajasthan and 0.41 MT from Gujarat. Last month, under PSS, the ministry approved the purchase of 0.1 MT of chana. Sources said that with arrivals of newly harvested chana in Maharashtra, the market prices are currently ruling 15% to 20% below the MSP of ₹5,875/quintal for the pulse for the current marketing season.

"The standing crop of chana is progressing well with the beginning of harvesting season. The government's procurement," Harsha Rai, head of Mayur Global, a leading pulses trading firm, told FE.

ISMA cuts sugar output estimates to 32.4 MT

THE SUGAR INDUSTRY on Wednesday revised downward its earlier projection of the sweetener's production in the 2025-26 season (Oct-Sept) to 32.4 million tonne (MT) from 34.35 MT citing lower productivity in Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra and Karnataka. Indian Sugarcane and Bio-energy Manufacturers Association (ISMA) while releasing the third advance estimates of sugar production stated that the sweetener's output is expected to rise by 10% to 32.4 MT in 2025-26 season against 29.6 MT in previous season. "The sugarcane yield in Uttar Pradesh is lower than earlier projections. This is primarily attributable to the ongoing varietal replacement programme in the state, which has temporarily impacted productivity levels," ISMA stated after its executive committee meeting.

In the key sugarcane-growing regions of Maharashtra and Karnataka, the yields per unit area are lower than initially

onwards, rather than being confined to only traditional river belts, the associations of sugar mills stated. "Early flowering, often triggered by abnormal weather patterns, including excess rainfall during key growth phases, accelerates cane maturity and reduces biomass accumulation, resulting in lighter, less productive stalks," ISMA stated. It has projected that while 3.1 MT sugar will be diverted for ethanol, the net sugar production during the current season is projected at 29.2 MT. The carry forward stock of the sweetener as on October 1, 2026, is projected at 5.3 MT, which will be more than adequate to meet the demand. The consumption of sugar is projected at 28.3 MT for the current sugar season. India is likely to export 0.7 MT of the sweetener in the current season. Based on post-monsoon Pan-India satellite imagery captured in October 2025, ISMA earlier stated that said the total sugarcane acreage in 2025-26 season is estimated at around 5.73 Mha, compared to 5.71 Mha in 2024-25 season.

tion measures. The estimated revenue income for 2026-27 stands at ₹51,510.94 crore, 19.35% higher than the previous budget estimate of ₹43,159.40 crore. The 2025-26 revenue income estimate was later revised upward to ₹46,778.12 crore, an increase of 8.38%. Yogi invites Japanese firms to invest in UP

UTTAR PRADESH CHIEF Minister Yogi Adityanath has invited Japanese entrepreneurs to visit and invest in the state. At the UP investment road show organised in Tokyo, the chief minister said Japanese companies would receive special benefits from the Japan Industrial City being developed near Noida International Airport. He

expressed confidence that investment in UP would further strengthen India-Japan industrial cooperation. The visit marks his first official visit to Japan. The chief minister proposed a global partnership in data centres, semiconductor and green energy, and has invited investment in tourism and hospitality sector as well. He said Uttar Pradesh (UP) has abundant freshwater resources, which can be utilised not only in

agriculture but also in emerging sectors such as green hydrogen. With 56% young population, the state offers adequate and skilled human resources to industries, he added. Yogi added that during the 2023 Global Investors Summit, UP received investment proposals worth ₹40 lakh crore. Projects worth approximately ₹15 lakh crore have already been grounded and ₹7 lakh crore investment is in process.
